King, chief of the CIA's Western Hemisphere Division, sent a confidential memorandum to CIA 8 , £ director Allen W. Dulles. King argued that in Cuba there existed a "far-left dictatorship, which if allowed to remain will 8 , £ encourage similar actions against U.S. holdings in other Latin American countries."
